

Offer Long-Acting Reversible Contraceptives (LARCs) as first-line option to every woman wanting to prevent pregnancy

What are LARCs?

- Copper Intra-Uterine Device (IUD): Load 375 or TT380
- Progesterone-Releasing Intra-Uterine Device (IUD): Mirena or Kyleena
- Sub-dermal implant: Implanon

LARC Facts:

- Are >99% effective at preventing pregnancy
- Lasts 3, 5 & 10 years, dependant on device: "set and forget"
- Are fully reversible: fertility returns immediately upon removal
- · Require doctor or nurse with specific training to insert



The choice of LARC or other contraceptive method is based on each woman's priorities, preferences, cultural background, and experience.


